IMPACT ON THE GROUND

"We have the opportunity to change lives as we expose, educate, and expand opportunities for young people," shared Kendell Monk, Senior Director BEEP, in celebration of our Business Executive Exchange Program (relaunched last July 2022) successful first year. The BEEP program partnered with 11 universities to offer career readiness and development sessions in partnership with UPS, Honda and Boeing. Students from HBCUs and other universities received mentorship and participated in professional development seminars and networking events.

Laying a new a path - The Equitable Justice and Strategic Initiatives division hosted a Legal Clinic at the 2023 National Conference Community Family Day Expo in Houston. The Legal Clinic partnered 40 attorneys with over 80 participants to provide free legal advice on record clearance, housing, estate planning, veterans affairs, and immigration. In addition, the National Urban League is working alongside the Houston Area Urban League to clear record for 254 clients pre-screened for record relief in the state of Texas



ADVOCACY IN ACTION

At the 2023 Annual Conference Marc H. Morial unveiled our Empowerment 2.0 strategy and commitment to Three D's: Defend Democracy, Demand Diversity Equity and Inclusion, and Defeat Poverty.

New Phase of Advocacy and Activism expands our Empowerment Agenda to build equity in employment, education, housing, health, and justice. Our hard-fought progress is under assault on every front, and it is our duty to galvanize Urban Leaguers, business and public leaders, and community members to ensure the future of our nation – the lives, livelihoods, and rights of all people.
