#### **FACES OF THE MOVEMENT**

Building opportunity, connecting community!

Meet Eu'nice McCoy, Senior Director, Events Marketing, and a proud National Urban League Young Professional.

P&A: Tell us more about your role at the National Urban League?

EM: I plan and execute the League's signature events, including National Urban League Conference, State of Black America, and Legislative Policy Conference. One of my favorites is the Leadership Summit, a weeklong professional development conference for all the Affiliate CEOs. It equips our leaders with the tools to go back to their home cities and implement the work on the ground more effectively.

P&A: How did you become an Urban Leaguer?

EM: <u>I started as an intern twelve years ago</u>. At the time, I was a college student at Adelphi University and was selected for the Jaggar Community Fellows Program, which connects students to summer internships in the nonprofit sector. I asked my godmother for advice on which organization to pick. She told me you are going to work for the National Urban League – they are a historic organization and do amazing things in the community and for people like us. I have been here ever since.

P&A: And how did your work at the National Urban League lead to your work with the Young Professionals?

EM: My godmother again! She kept mentioning that she was going to my job – for the HBCU Fair, the Empowerment Day. I worked on events and quickly realized she was referring to the local affiliate, the New York Urban League. I joined her and started volunteering. I served on a lot of different leadership committees, programs and community service, membership culture, then membership chair, and most recently chapter president from 2020 to 2022.

We are enabling individuals to no longer remain dependent on government programs, social services or family members but to work and prosper on their own accord!

The National Urban League advocates for housing and economic opportunity.

Earlier this summer, we along with other civil rights and economic justice organizations filed an amicus brief in the U.S. Supreme Court case to defend the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau and commend the Court's decision to reject predatory payday lenders' exploitative practices, which target communities of color.

"We are relieved the justices saw through the lenders' specious claims and upheld the nation's most meaningful effort in generations to protect its citizens from financial wrongdoing." P&A: Over all the years – and all the events, what has been the most rewarding experience as a Young Professional?

EM: The New York Urban League's HBCU Fair. It has a special place in my heart because you see the difference you are making in kids' lives immediately. Over 5,000 students come out and meet with recruiters, who offer both college acceptance and scholarships on the spot. They also get to experience the culture – the step shows, the bands, the Greek strolls. In that moment, you witness these kids seeing their future, knowing they are going to college and all the things that will be available to them. As an African American woman, it is especially meaningful to support the next generation.

P&A: To conclude, why should someone consider joining their local Young Professionals?

EM: If you are looking to make an impact, if you want to give back to your community, you can do that! The National Urban League and the Affiliates have been helping people for 114 years who need education, jobs, and housing, and to overcome injustice to have economic parity and economic self-reliance.


## **EXPANDING YOUR IMPACT**
